To whom it may concern.

I have read the RCC proposals in regards to Lyddington and the surrounding area.

The recategorisation is of great concern as this opens the possibility of potential further development in and around the village. Since further recent development on the Gretton side of Corby the traffic flow in and through the village to UCC has dramatically increased and has resulted in significant increase in speeding traffic, road noise , danger to children and other road users, and damage to road surfaces. I own a grade 2 listed house on the main road and the increase in traffic has damaged the fabric of the building and the air quality in the house has deteriorated due to the increase in the road traffic. To allow further development in the village would worsen the impact of the already disproportionate traffic flow through the village which is valued as historically significant in regards to the village scape , has areas designated as conservation areas and has many listed buildings along the main road.

In regards to wind farms and solar panel development along the A 6003 not only would this fundamentally change the character of Lyddington it would seem to be at odds with the the Site of Special Scientific Interest at the Eyebrooke Reservoir and would have a negative impact on many of the fauna in the area especially the birdlife.
